Artist Biography

Abstract artist Robert Coulter creates his paintings at home by the Lake in Gimli, usually while listening to classical music. Bob has worked in many mediums over the years, but became interested in digital painting—the medium in which he now works—shortly after retiring from teaching and reinventing himself as a full-time artist.

His work has been exhibited in galleries in Gimli, Winnipeg Beach, Winnipeg, Toronto and Vancouver. He has had several solo exhibitions, most recently "Time Signatures," March/April 2013 at Cre8ery Gallery and Studio, where, as a member, he also exhibits regularly in the Auxiliary Gallery. His paintings have appeared in juried shows across Canada and in various members' shows at Cre8ery as well as four times in "Painting on the Edge," the Federation of Canadian Artists annual Open National and International Juried Exhibition.
